Our tomato and potato plants are all getting very tall and we are all looking forward to tasting them!

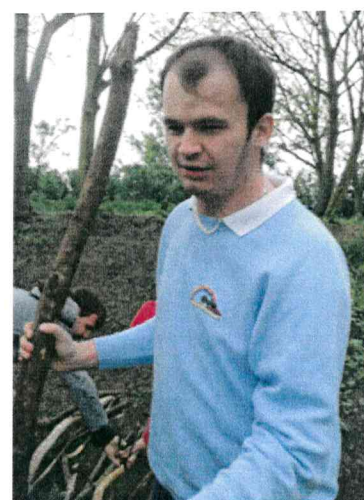
