




We have been working with Joe from Jessie's Fund and following up with music sessions in the classroom.

We will be selling our products: in school; at a pop up shop at Homebase (to be arranged); at our school Christmas event.


We can also make products to order if you see something specific you would like or have a specific idea.
























Beech Class Outdoor Learning




The sixth form members of the class went to a careers and preparation for adulthood day at
