

Dear Parent/Guardian,

We have had a busy first few weeks, with an exciting project taking place with Jessie's Fund a music charity that work in schools, they will be with us for a total of 18 days working with the pupils and the staff to develop music in school.

We welcomed one new pupil last term and are working hard with our senior pupils to help them plan for the future and their next steps. This year there are many changes occurring in the Post 16 and Post 18 funding and the way these stages will be organised. We as a school continue to wish to support all our learners as long as The Grove School is the right provision for them; however, some learners may wish to leave and attend college at 16 or 18 yrs, rather than stay at The Grove School until they are 18 or 19 yrs. The decision on whether or not a pupil will be able to continue with their education at The Grove School, Post 16, is not our decision it is the decision of the Post 16 panel. We will need to show that a young person can make progress towards employment or training if they are to receive funding or not. The young person would need to be looking to attend a college/education placement after these two years and they will need to show that moving to college at 16 would not be appropriate, some authorities are only funding 3 days of education for Post 16 pupils at college or in school. These are huge changes; we had an open morning recently to share these with parents and intend to have another meeting in the summer term. I am aware that for many of you this will be of great concern please feel free to contact school, we have also put a flow chart together to explain the process that is on our website.























The children have followed up their visits by making colourful art work and helping to building a tractor



We spend our business money on treats for our class room and fun days out with our friends.






















